Dorchester features more than 4,000 acres, professional hunters and shooters on staff, and a lodge. It offers quail hunting on 1,000 acres, duck hunting in flooded timber blinds or cypress duck ponds, continental pheasant hunts, and deer hunting. Dorchester also offers a 15-station sporting clay course and skeet and trap range.

In addition, Members are invited to enjoy horseback riding on the trails. Experienced riders may reserve a Club horse, and boarders may take their own horses.

Two complimentary golf carts are available at Dorchester for Ford members. Ford member Gene McQuown is shown on a recent trip to Dorchester.

ARB UPDATE—BUILDING ACTIVITY

We continue to see increased home building activity at The Ford Plantation. The Architectural Review Board, which provides architectural and landscaping design oversight for the Plantation, provides the following update:

Three residences are under construction:

- Lot 68 - Kopac - Main House Addition/Carriage House
- Lot M30 - Reczek - Garage Addition

Four additional homes have been approved

and construction is expected to begin before the end of the year:

- Lot 203 - Samford - Main House/Garage
- Lot 212 - Culver - Carriage House/Garage
- Lot M08 - Fielding - Main House/Garage
- Lot M10 - McQuown - Trophy Building/Main House

As we look ahead to Q1 2013, we expect to see almost double digits in active projects. This activity level is quite promising as we see the Plantation grow, and with each new home, become even more compelling.



THAI MASSAGE AT THE SPA



Starting December 12, The Spa will offer Thai Massages by Heather Burtis, who is studying at the Thai Massage School in Chiang Mai, Thailand. Thai massage uses passive stretching and gentle pressure to increase flexibility and relieve muscle and joint tension. Thai massage is both deeply relaxing and energizing. Techniques consist of working the energy lines, known as Sen, by applying press-

ing techniques with hands, thumbs, feet, elbows and knees; treating Acupressure points found within energy lines; and performing Yoga-style stretching which is often referred to as Yoga Massage. A traditional Thai Massage lasts approximately 2-2.5 hours and is performed on a mat on the floor with the client remaining fully clothed. If you have never had the opportunity to experience the healing effects of Thai Massage, this is your chance!

PRESERVATION AND MODERNIZATION PROGRAM MOVING FORWARD

The projects in The Ford Plantation's Preservation and Modernization Program are moving along according to schedule. The PMP is a \$9.3 million reinvestment in Ford's key facilities, amenities, and infrastructure, including the renowned Pete Dye-designed golf course.

The PMP was designed to identify critical work needed to maintain the community's most valuable and appreciated assets for current members and their families, while ensuring the health and vitality of the Club for future generations. This plan will keep The Ford Plantation securely in place among the nation's most distinguished and desirable communities.

Thus far the project management team has led the completion of both the Lake Clara and McAllister Dike Trails and the purchase of the new FreeMotion Fitness Equipment for the Sports Barn. The balance of the capital projects will proceed under a specified timeline and are scheduled to be completed by the fourth quarter of 2014. As design efforts progress for projects like the Sports Barn and Lake Dye Grill, renderings will be shared with members.

The golf course restoration project will begin with a January 2013 "soft start" in the back 9 wetlands, with the major renovation work to commence in October 2013.
